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



- Who we are

YearOut organizes international volunteering activities in support of organizations working in developing countries. The association was founded in 2006 by Alice Riva following a first-hand volunteering experience in India with an English association. Hence the desire to found YearOut in Italy, promoting the idea of taking a break to have a unique experience and encouraging the mobility of young people thanks to a new concept of volunteering: the energy of volunteers can make a contribution to success of development projects, and for this reason it must be valorised. Everyone can leave, everyone's support is very important. Over the years, many volunteers have left offering their skills and leaving their mark.

YearOut's task is therefore to coordinate the needs of the partners with the skills of the volunteers participating in the project. YearOut is aimed primarily at young people, the most important resource available for designing change. Having a volunteering experience means becoming aware of what is happening in the world, to plan a better future.

Young people are more inclined to change and acquire new ways of thinking; they are creative, innovative and determined. This is why YearOut decided to turn to them.

YearOut feels part of a larger program, thanks to the participation of more than 600 young volunteers contributed to supporting the objectives dictated by the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.


YearOut has activated partnerships with Italian and local organizations with long experience in the field of development cooperation in the following destinations: Italy, Kenya, Namibia, Uganda, Madagascar, Nepal, India, Philippines and Costa Rica.

Volunteers can leave for a period of one, two or three months, and it is also possible to extend the experience once the validity of the visa has been verified. One month is considered the minimum period to come into contact with the reality of the place and with the problems related to the beneficiaries.

The first week is dedicated to learning about projects, planning activities with the local staff and to settle into a new context, with customs different from those you are used to, in fact you will live in close contact with the reality of the host country.

SHORT TERM PROGRAM

To meet the needs of those who cannot dedicate one or more months to international volunteering, YearOut has selected some projects where it is possible to stop for even 2 weeks. The destinations where this is possible are: Italy, Kenya, Namibia, Uganda, Madagascar, Nepal, Costa Rica.



SOCIAL & MEDICAL PROJECTS

YearOut's social projects are aimed at children and communities who live in difficult conditions because they are abandoned and/or in situations of extreme poverty. The activities you carry out will be useful for promoting the growth and more complete education of children, your work will be studied with partners.



ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS

With YearOut you will be able to participate in projects aimed at safeguarding the fauna and flora heritage within protected areas, living immersed in the nature of the country of the local partner with whom you will collaborate.



THE PROJECT

Volunteers can choose to participate in projects in Nairobi or in the Masai Mara.

Accommodation

During the volunteer period in Nairobi, volunteers stay in the volunteer house in Waithaka.

• Teaching: The role of volunteers is crucial in offering new stimulation and support to a teaching team that is often insufficient in relation to the number of pupils. You can support teaching at school and run computer literacy workshops.

• Water project: the aim is to provide adequate access to drinking water for the community. Volunteers can do manual work to support the project and organise water-saving awareness workshops for children and adults in the vicinity.

THE PROJECT

The project takes place in the village of Rombo, on the border between Kenya and Tanzania. The objective is to guarantee school education, a daily meal and access to drinking water for Maasai children. There are many objectives to be achieved, but thanks to the staff and the precious contribution of the volunteers the project is destined to grow and improve. As a volunteer you will be able to help in various areas:

- in the school volunteers can prepare lessons and workshops for Maasai children. Content can vary, from art to HIV awareness projects, life skills, theatre, English, history and geography;
- home visit: you may notice absences or loss of interest in school activities. Children are often involved in activities that overlap with school time. The volunteers, with the local staff, will try to make parents understand the importance of guaranteeing an education for their children, despite the daily difficulties;
- distance support update: many children benefit from distance support. The volunteers will be able to help the local staff in updating the documents relating to each child, translating report cards, letters, taking photos and collecting material.

Accommodation


The volunteers will live in a guest house where the project manager: Elaine, stays. It is located near the project. Meals will be prepared by the staff.

Language

The volunteer is required to have a reasonable knowledge of English.

THE PROJECT

The environmental project in Namibia takes place near Windhoek, in the Wildlife Sanctuary, a natural reserve that provides a safe refuge for various animal species at risk. The objective is the long-term rehabilitation of the animals and their reintegration into their natural habitat of origin.

The activities in this project include:

- facilities;
- difficulty;
- collection of data;
- camera trapping;
- game counting;
- carnivore monitoring.

You will also be able to take part in research sites projects in the Neuras area, a truly spectacular setting which is located in southern Namibia, Kanaan and TimBilai, where volunteers focus on finding animals in the wild, in particular African elephants and wild African dogs.

Accommodation

The volunteers stay in tents inside the nature reserve, with the volunteers of the social project, together with other international volunteers as well.



THE PROJECT

The project in Namibia also includes social and medical volunteering activities. These programmes are located in the Clever Cubs School, in the natural reserve, and at the Lifeline Medical Clinic in Epukiro. The objective is to improve the living conditions of the "San", one of the oldest communities in the world.

- School volunteer project The Clever Cubs School offers free will then be able to enroll in a government school in Windhoek.
- Medical volunteer project The San live in conditions of extreme injured and patients and providing emergency healthcare.

Accommodation

THE PROJECT

As a volunteer you will be able to take part in the activities of a confessional mission, belonging to the Catholic Church, in the rural area of Ntungamo which manages a reception center for girls in a state of vulnerability, an educational center for children and young people with moderate and serious physical and cognitive disabilities and a nursery school dedicated to disadvantaged families. As a volunteer you can take part in the following projects:

- in afternoon entertainment activities.
- learning of these children, with the support of specialised staff.
- arrangement of the premises.
- recreational activities to support the staff.

Accommodation

The volunteer will stay inside the Guest House equipped with all comforts such as hot water, drinking water, showers, internet, sheets and towels.

You will live in close contact with the missionaries so that you can see up close and fully experience the life of a lay Franciscan missionary community.



THE PROJECT

The project takes place on the volcanic island of Nosy Komba, also known as 'lemur island', which is located in northern Madagascar. The objective of the environmental volunteering project in Madagascar is to contribute to the conservation of Madagascar's flora and fauna by acting in the following areas:

- project by collecting data on lemurs and other animal species.

Accommodation

The volunteer accommodation is located within the Turtle Cove research centre on the island of Nosy Komba. As a volunteer you will stay in eco-bungalows, sharing rooms with other volunteers. THE PROJECT

The project in Madagascar is located on the island of Nosy Komba and includes social volunteering activities, with interventions aimed at the development of the local community.

The objective of the project is to improve the level of English of students attending local schools and of the community.

THE PROJECT

The project is located in Kathmandu, the capital of Nepal, in the Pepsi Cola area. The objectives of the project are to prevent the lack of services in the fields of education, health and women's rights. As a volunteer you will be able to support the staff in various areas:

THE PROJECT

As a volunteer, you will support the staff in various areas:

- You will organise activities within the Girls' Empowerment project, with the aim of inspiring girls and adolescents to reflect on their condition and reach their potential.
- You will assist and play with children at the Day Care Centre, their homework, always in cooperation with local caregivers.
- Volunteers will also spend time organising workshops with members to use.



THE PROJECT

The project is located in the province of Guanacaste, on the Pacific coast, in the village of Ostional, which is 95 km from Liberia airport, a three-hour drive away.

The goal is to balance human development and the conservation of natural resources. The central point of the project is the study and protection of the turtles of Ostional, whose beaches are affected by the "arribadas" phenomenon.

As a volunteer you will be able to support the staff in various areas: • you will patrol the beaches during the night to prevent illegal hunting: patrolling shifts on the beach do not require specific skills, it will be sufficient to rely on the local staff and be willing to walk for kilometers,

THE PROJECT

The projects are in the hinterland of Sicily, where the reception centers for migrants and their families are located. It is precisely in these locations that their journey of integration with the local community begins.

The reception services include a series of initiatives also aimed at strengthening their skills, through education, training and job placement.

By participating in the volunteering project, you will collaborate with the staff, which also includes migrants, taking care of:

- Community development taking care of activating literacy and mathematics and other interdisciplinary subjects.
- Home visits as a volunteer you will carry out visits to the homes where the young migrants live, in order to support them.



#3 Enhance your skills

International volunteering is a fundamental experience for acquiring informal skills, that is, everything we learn in new, temporary contexts, which are rarely structured under conventional rhythms or planned teaching. The job landscape requires new graduates to have many of the soft-skills which can be acquired through international volunteering. Upon your return, YearOut will help you identify them and use them correctly for your future job search. You will also have the opportunity to improve your English!

What expenses do I have to pay to leave as a volunteer?

Those approaching international volunteering and learning that there are expenses may be disoriented, here you will understand why it is necessary to pay a contribution to leave:

1. Become a YearOut Member:

To start, at the time of registration we will invite you to pay the membership fee of 20 euros.

2. Pay your participation fee:

The participation fee varies based on the project and the number of weeks of stay. You are asked to pay a fee because receiving a volunteer involves additional costs for the hosting partner, including accommodation and food costs, financing of on-site activities, transport and travel. And thanks to your share, the partner who hosts you will have the opportunity to activate new projects and achieve their goals, also thanks to your help.


YearOut is an independent non-profit association, also financed thanks to the contributions of volunteers, and does not receive funds from governments and other organizations. Also remember that donating is worth it! YearOut is an APS (Social Promotion Association) and therefore all donations give the right to tax benefits during the tax return phase.

AS A YEAROUT MEMBER, YOUR CONTRIBUTION INCLUDES:

- Welcome at the airport and transfer to the project
- Room and board
- Materials needed for volunteer activities
- Transport for the project during the volunteering period
- Pre-departure support from YearOut staff and assistance from the local coordinator, including medical emergencies

YearOut encourages volunteers to collect the necessary donation through fundraising activities: some volunteers have savings aside, but this is often not the case with young volunteers. YearOut offers the necessary support to raise the amount, volunteers will be able to coordinate with us to organize awareness and fundraising initiatives. The association also provides volunteers with a Fundraising Guide; part of the adventure will be to explain to people that, with their financial support, they are indirectly benefiting the development projects you will work on.

Upon your arrival at the airport you will be greeted by a local staff member who will accompany you to your destination. During your volunteering period you will always have a coordinator to turn to, even on your return you will be accompanied airport.



We will provide you with precise instructions for obtaining an entry visa in the countries that require it. The cost varies depending on the length of stay and the country.

If once at your destination you want to extend your stay, the local staff will help you.



YearOut issues a certificate that exempts, totally or partially, from paying for services in some ATS (formerly ASL). We will provide you with an InfoPack with information on recommended and mandatory vaccinations.

However, your ATS will be responsible for deciding with you which vaccines to administer and which prophylaxist to follow.



To ensure that volunteers can travel safely, YearOut has partnered with Siscos at a discounted cost. If before leaving you decide to stay longer in the place where you will work as a volunteer to visit the country, the insurance will be extendable at minimal costs and you will be able to travel with peace of mind even when the project is finished.



YearOut can stipulate agreements with your school or university so that you can receive credits after your volunteering experience. It also supports students if they want to write a project and apply for scholarships to be able to leave. Upon request, YearOut issues a certificate of participation which reports the activities carried out during the volunteering period.



There is no limit of age to participate in volunteering projects. YearOut projects are available for people of all ages from 18 years old. In the projects you will find volunteers of different countries and ages that will share the experience with you.





Group departures can be organised. Also in this case it is necessary to have an information and selection interview. It's important to start planning your trip well in advance to ensure there is enough place for everyone. YearOut is available to collaborate with schools and universities to create departures for groups of students willing to collaborate and share a special experience.



In the pre-departure period and while you are volunteering abroad, the YearOut staff will be available to provide all the necessary information and update parents and relatives on the current activities.

- FAQ

Where can I go?

Costa Rica, Italy, Kenya (Nairobi or Rombo), Namibia, Madagascar, Nepal, Philippines, India and Uganda.

What do I have to do to leave?

Choose one of the ways to get to know us and once you have all the information you need we will guide you step by step in planning your international volunteering experience.

What age should I be?

There are no particular age restrictions, except for being 18 years old. Some projects may require you to be at least 21 years old. YearOut tries to start homogeneous groups to ensure that coexistence is collaborative and pleasant for everyone.

Do I need to know languages?

Knowledge of English is usually required for projects in Africa and Asia. In Costa Rica the necessary languages are English or Spanish,

It is not necessary to have excellent knowledge, but it is important to have the linguistic ability to communicate adequately, particularly for projects in which international volunteers are also present.

Is experience required to volunteer?

No particular experience is required and the fact of not having it does not represent an obstacle to starting. Your skills will determine the work you do. for example volunteers with greater expertise in the medical/nursing sector will be able to organize health, prevention and nutrition training workshops, while those with artistic skills will be able to carry out recreational activities in a creative way, etc.

When can I leave? When should I sign up?

It is possible to leave at any time of the year. It is advisable to start planning your trip approximately 3 months before departure.

In some cases, the staff is also available to organize last minute departures. The sooner you sign up and get to know us, the sooner you will have the chance to leave!

What does my donation to YearOut cover?

The donation you pay to YearOut will cover transport costs to/from the airport (with the exception of some projects), daily travel for the project, food and accommodation, the materials necessary for the activities and 24-hour assistance of the local staff.

In addition to the amount allocated to the project that will host you, part of the donation will remain with YearOut to support the information, training, selection and planning costs incurred by the Milan office.

How do I collect the donation to be able to leave?

What is not included?

Air flight, visa, vaccinations, insurance policy, personal expenses, tourist excursions.

What health precautions should I take before leaving? Do I have to get vaccinated?

The vaccinations required, mandatory or recommended, change depending on the country and the period in which you want to go. We recommend contacting the ATS for all relevant information. YearOut will provide you with a certificate attesting to your volunteer status, so you can have deductions or total exemption from the cost of vaccines.

What purpose can participating in one of these projects help me?

Having a volunteering experience abroad will allow you to open your eyes to the world, learn about a new culture by coming into direct contact with local communities. You will have the opportunity to create a concrete change for the community in which you will work. You will realize that you will receive a lot from the community where you will work and from the children, you will acquire new skills also through exchanges with people different from you.

Can I get training credits with my volunteering experience?

Many universities recognize volunteering periods abroad with training credits. Each University follows different procedures, which is why we ask you to inform yourself about this possibility directly from the internship or international relations office of your University. YearOut is available to issue documents certifying the volunteering period abroad or, if necessary, to stipulate agreements with universities for the validation of training credits.

Internships, theses and scholarships

YearOut is available to stipulate agreements with universities so that the volunteering period is recognized as an internship or allows for recognized training credits. We also support students with information material and advice in drafting projects to participate in calls for scholarships or for thesis projects.

Will I have the opportunity to speak with those who have already had this experience?

Of course, you will have the opportunity to talk to ex-volunteers and ask them all the questions you want! Our ex-volunteers are very helpful, they continue to carry out their volunteer work even upon their return, supporting YearOut and the association that hosted them in many ways.
